

Teaching CPR/AED use on Women

Why this matters.

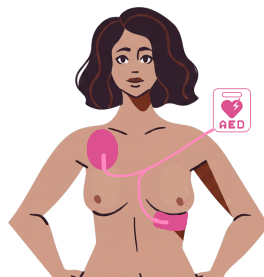
Women are less likely to receive CPR & defibrillation.

Hesitation can delay lifesaving action.

Your role is to build confidence to act.

Key Messages

- Act quickly (every second counts)
- Place your hand in centre of chest
- You can't make the situation worse
- Use an AED early rather than later
- Legal protections exist for people performing CPR
- DO NOT HESITATE!



"You may need to place your hands over breast tissue to perform CPR correctly. This is normal and should not delay action."

"Acting quickly saves lives."

"It's the same position for everyone."

Bring it into your classes



Include CPR on women in discussion



Use female manikins, bras or address it clearly



Normalise correct hand placement



Include AED use on women



Discuss legal protections



Encourage open conversation

⚡ AED use on women

- Remove clothing
- Remove bra if needed
- Attach pads as shown
- Lift/move breast if required
- Do not hesitate!
